- **Major prerequisite structure for MG Majors:**
All MG courses have GB 215 as a prerequisite. Upper level Management course prerequisites vary.
- **Human Resources Management**
MG 250 is a required course for the human resources concentration. MG 250 is a pre-requisite for both MG 350 and 351, also required courses for the concentration. MG 350 and 351 are not, as a rule, taught in the same term. The HR concentration is therefore, at minimum, a three semester process.
- **Management Global Electives:**
 - MG 331, 332, 334, or a MG 340 Special Topics in Management Section with a Global Focus
